Many ideas, helpful hints and methods of accomplishment are exchanged during informal discussions about the models present. The San Diego Ship Modelers Guild Sponsors two major events each year. The first being a Static Display Contest in March which is held aboard the San Diego Maritime Museum Ferry "Berkeley." The second is a Radio Controlled Regatta in September and held at the San Diego Model yacht basin in Mission Bay. Modelers come from as far away as Monterey, California and many come from the Los Angeles area. The caliber of modeling has been extremely high. One benefit of the guild is the monthly newsletter with items of upcoming events, craft tips and related articles. For this we trade newsletters with other guilds such as New York and Los Angeles. 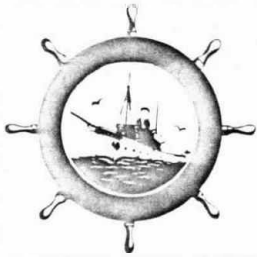

# San Diego Ship Modelers' Guild

THE SAN DIEGO SHIP MODELER'S GUILD, IN COOPERATION WITH THE SAN DIEGO MARITIME MUSEUM, IS SPONSERING ITS THIRD ANNUAL SCALE SHIP MODEL COMPETITION AND EXHIBITION ON SATURDAY MARCH 20 AND SUNDAY MARCH 21, 1982 ABOARD THE FERRY BOAT BERKELEY AT THE EMBARCADERO. NEARLY EVERY TYPE OF VESSEL FROM THE EARLY DAYS OF SAIL TO MODERN NUCLEAR POWERED SHIPS, AND FROM SMALL PLEASURE CRAFT TO GIANT NAVAL AND MERCHANT SHIPS FIT INTO THIS YEARS CATEGORIES OF "SAIL", "POWER (MILITARY)", "POWER (CIVIL & COMMERCIAL)", AND "PLASTIC MODELS". AWARDS WILL BE MADE FOR EACH OF THE FOUR (4) ABOVE CATEGORIES IN ADDITION TO A BEST OF SHOW AWARD.

REGISTRATION OF ENTRIES WILL BEGIN AT 10:00 AM SATURDAY, MARCH 20, WITH THE JUDGING TO START AT 1:00 PM THAT AFTERNOON. THERE WILL BE A REGISTRATION FEE OF \$3.00 PER MODEL OR COLLECTION ENTERED.

INDIVIDUALS THAT ARE PLANNING TO ENTER A MODEL (MEMBER OR NON-MEMBER) ARE CORDIALLY INVITED TO ATTEND OUR REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING ABOARD THE STAR OF INDIA AT 8:00 PM FRIDAY NIGHT MARCH 19 — MODEL ENTRIES MAY BE BROUGHT TO THE MEETING FRIDAY NIGHT TO ELIMINATE SOME OF THE LAST MINUTE RUSH ON SATURDAY MORNING.

THE PUBLIC IS INVITED TO ATTEND THE EXHIBITION AND AT THE SAME TIME HELP TO SUPPORT OUR SAN DIEGO MARITIME MUSEUM. THE LOW ADMISSION FEE TO THE MUSEUM INCLUDES "STAR OF INDIA", "BERKELEY", AND "MEDEA". THE MAJORITY OF MODELS IN THE EXHIBITION WILL BE ON DISPLAY ABOARD THE "BERKELEY" FOR SOME TIME FOLLOWING THE COMPETITION.
